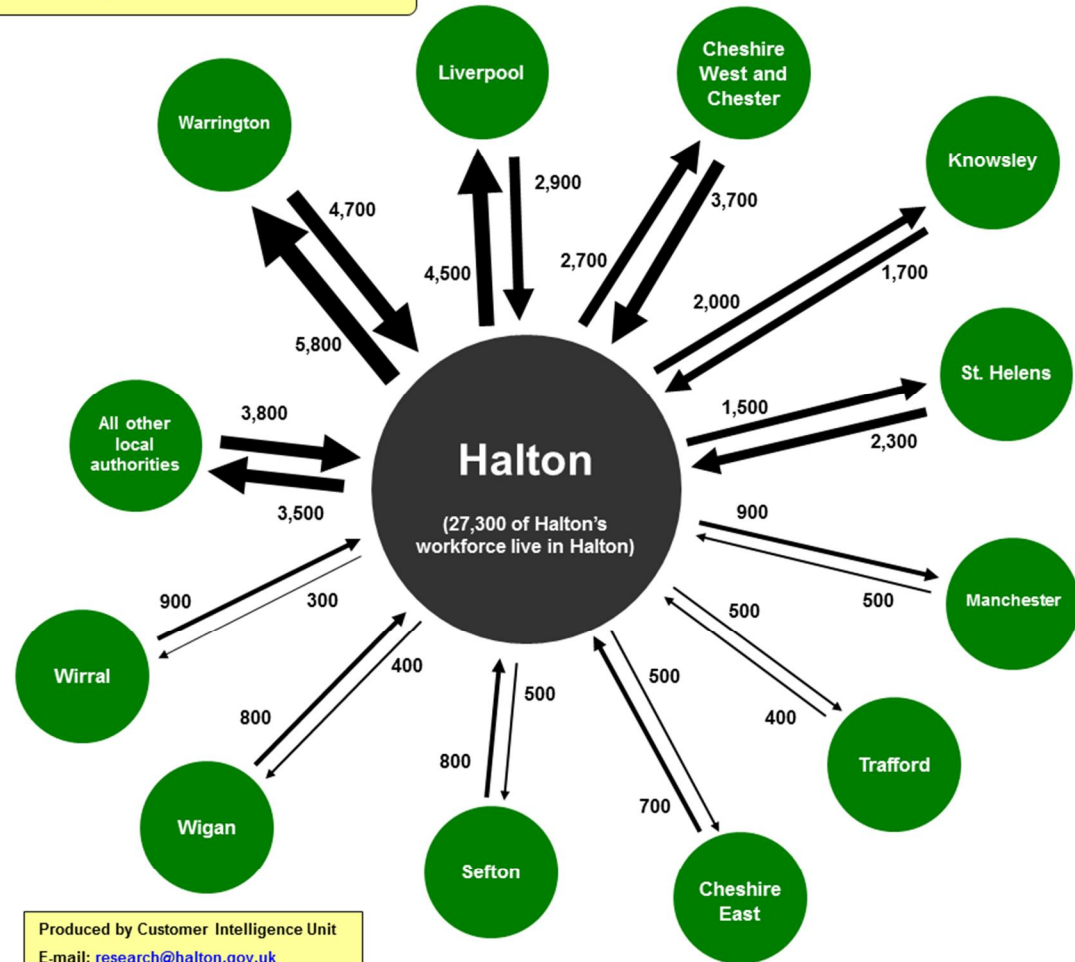


Commuting flows to/from Halton in 2011 (Census 2011 data)

Key points:

- The three largest inflow counts of workers into Halton are from Warrington (4,700), Cheshire West & Chester (3,700) and Liverpool (2,900)
- The three largest outflow counts of workers from Halton are to Warrington (5,800), Liverpool (4,500) and Cheshire West & Chester (2,700)
- The largest net inflow of workers into Halton is from Cheshire West & Chester (1,000 net workers coming into Halton)
- The largest net outflow of workers from Halton is to Liverpool (-1,600 net workers going to Liverpool from Halton)
- Compared to the 2001 census data, the largest rise in workers commuting into Halton is seen from Liverpool (rising from 2,100 in 2001 to 2,900 in 2011). The largest decline is seen from Cheshire West and Chester (falling from 4,600 in 2001 to 3,700 in 2011)
- Compared to the 2001 census data, the largest rise in workers commuting out from Halton is seen to Liverpool (rising from 3,700 in 2001 to 4,500 in 2011). The largest decline is seen to Wirral (falling from 400 in 2001 to 300 in 2011)
