

PRIVACY NOTICE – BUSINESS RATES

Who is the Data Controller for the information I provide?

Halton Borough Council is the Data Controller for the personal information you provide.

We collect and hold information about you in order to assess and collect Council Tax.

Why do you need my information?

We need your data in order to comply with our legal obligation to assess and collect Business Rates.

What legal basis allows you to use my information?

The legal basis which allows us to use your information is the Local Government Finance Act 1992.

Do I have to provide this information and what will happen if I don't?

You must provide this information as failure to do so will mean we are unable to bill you correctly and collect Business Rates due to the Council. If we are unable to do so our ability to raise and collect the revenue required to provide all council services will be limited.

Who will my information be shared with?

Your information may be shared with other departments within Halton Borough Council and the following organisations;

How long will you keep this information for and why?

Documents and e-mails will be kept for seven years. Computerised account information within the Northgate Revenues and Benefits system will be kept indefinitely to allow backdated amendments in relation to changes to valuation changes as there is currently no limit on the length of time the Valuation Office Agency can backdate a rateable value reduction.

How will my information be stored?

Your data will be stored electronically in databases on a secure network and/or securely in paper form.
