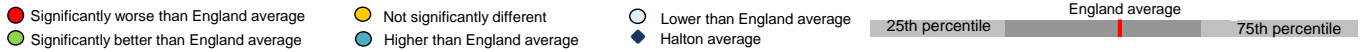


Summary of child health and well-being
