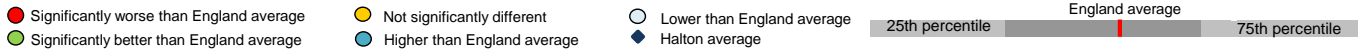


2018 Child Health Profile for Norton South
